


Dear A&BS Colleagues,

## **BEHIND THE BADGE**



UCIPD hosted its first 'Behind the Badge' event for faculty and staff in partnership with UCI Staff Assembly. Information was strategically separated into three categories: Administration & Investigations, Academy 101, and Patrol Operations. These three topics gave UCI faculty and staff a comprehensive look at the UCI Police Department's operational fundamentals and a unique insight to the daily life of a police officer.

Attendees learned about the inner workings of a police department and the arduous training standards of the Orange County Sheriff's Academy. Officer Patton and Officer Akingbemi led the Academy 101 module, sharing their insights into the training program. The duo explained the program's high-stress environment is deliberately designed to aid the officers in developing a high tolerance level, as officers frequently encounter stressful situations in the field. Chief Cisneros participated throughout the event and spoke in each of the modules, helping to expand on the talking points of the officers. Between his humorous stories, he shared his vision for the department, goals, and hiring standards, reassuring the community that the UCI Police Department is a highly skilled and professional organization that is here to serve the community.

## HAZARDOUS WASTE TEAM

Environmental Health & Safety and Risk Services' Hazardous Waste Team collects, processes, and disposes of chemical, biomedical, radioactive, controlled substances, eWaste, mercury lamps, and universal hazardous waste generated by UCI facilities. UCI's <u>Hazardous Waste Team</u> is among the smallest in the

UC system, and this highly effective team averages 30 pickups per day which translates to 200 tons of hazardous waste per year! Management of hazardous waste must be in accordance with federal, state, and local regulations. The team helps protect human health and the environment by removing barriers and simplifying processes. Recently, the team started to provide pre-labeled hazardous waste containers, routine automatic waste pickups, and instituted a <u>Text a Pickup</u> service which saves customers over 500 hours per year versus the traditional online requests.

#### UCPath



<u>UCPath</u> is the University of California's priority program to implement a comprehensive payroll, benefits, human resources, and academic personnel system for all UC employees. UCPath is the largest administrative project in UC history and is scheduled to go-live at UCI in July 2018.

#### **DMV Registration Services**



UCI is now offering California Department of Motor Vehicles (DMV) automated services, becoming the first university and first independent location in California. UCI faculty, staff, students and visitors may now process vehicle registrations or file for Planned Non-Operational status through an automated DMV NOW Self-Service Terminal. Personal Protection Equipment (PPE) Program

Environmental Health & Safety's <u>PPE Program</u> provides labs with personal protective equipment - lab coats, safety glasses, goggles, and face shields - at no charge to laboratory employees. During a fit appointment, employees are integrated into a culture of safety, receive personal instruction on the proper fit for their coat and eyewear, and learn how to utilize the available free laundry service. #### **Medical Sciences C Renovation**



<u>Facilities Management</u> completed a major building maintenance project for the Med Sci C building. This 56,000 square foot medical research building was constructed in 1978 and all of the major mechanical equipment as well as the roof were at the end of useful life. A construction contract was awarded for approximately \$8 million; which included replacement of the roof, major rooftop mechanical equipment, interior laboratory controls upgrades, interior and exterior lighting upgrades, modern drop ceilings in laboratories, and corridor flooring and painting.
