

Celebrate National Bike Month with UCI



Expecting the Unexpected: Emergency Preparedness



Emergency Management Director, Anne Widney-LeSage, and retired Emergency Services Manager, Linda Bogue, hosted an Emergency Preparedness Workshop for the UCI Center for Emeriti and Retirees on March 28th.

The workshop covered how to prepare yourself and your family for various types of emergencies common in Orange County including: earthquake, active assailant, wildfire, power outage, flooding,

and tsunami. Participants worked in groups to develop a list of items for their disaster preparedness kit and were encouraged to go home and evaluate what items they currently have and what they need to purchase to complete their emergency kit. The training also covered how to customize a preparedness kit and plans for small children, elderly adults, individuals with disabilities, access, and functional needs, and pets. Last, but not least, the group discussed travel safety tips and how to be prepared while traveling domestically and internationally.

UCI Hits its Goal: Ranks Top 10 for RecycleMania




UCI has sealed its rank in the top 5% of the nation in this year's RecycleMania, and achieved the Top 10 standing in the competition seven years in a row. Our rank in the national standing is ninth in overall Diversion Rate and sixth in Total Recycling for the Bragging Rights category.
